

What we created together was swift, fun + changed lives.














We made a school that worked like a little jewellery box, layering uses across the site to create multiple levels of activity...

Because we think sport can effect social change, when that is so hard to do these days...








We know, this lot don't look subversive...

## So we did some magic thinking via some boring numbers stuff with the Captain of the club, Mark. We had an idea as to how we could create free rowing for schools...




We showed that at the moment the site is hardly used at all (well apart from the end of the annual Oxford v Cambridge boat race) + that there was a LOT of potential to increase access...





# Making places to live in;


We know that good place-making is about creating different tenure homes + communities, mixing spaces + people; excellence is not easy.

We continue to work at this scale seeking the opportunities with clients to make simple but well made homes which become part of a city...








650 BTR homes alongside the canal and river just 10 min from the station...

We continue to major on low carbon development / retrofit / adaptive reuse of existing buildings where we find them, such as this agricultural building near Rochdale...






...which we are converting into a new Golf Club at an established course, set in a landscape with over 50,000 trees...

# **Chris Boyce**

In summer of 2017 with the support of two key clients Chris started Assorted Skills + Talents\* a new modern practice located in Manchester, and London where he lives.

An award winning leader, Project Director + Designer, Chris is former board Director for Capita | ESA (Architecture Environment and Planning), Design Director at CJCT architects and has over 20 years in the profession, including the first two years at the office of Sir James Stirling.

From master planning to commercial offices across civic, community and regeneration projects Chris has led teams ranging from a handful to large groups of cross discipline professionals, and was Design Director for Captia | ESA for six years when they ranked #5 in the AJ100.

Chris leads on the output of the practice taking a particular delight in the RIBA stage 0/1 work, the establishment of social and commercial agendas, stretching the role of architect to encompass brief writing, engagement and community based strategies to gain buy in based on trust and "social investment" from clients, as well as strategic design roles with wider bodies, across both local government and private developers.

A designer at heart he came to architecture from fine art and painting, and continues to draw daily, working on paper to establish design parameters. However new modes of communication of design are central to AST\* with a fully BIM level 2 studio structure, VR/AR capability, prototyping physically and using digital model images to convey design process at each step.

Chris has found many areas where architects fail their clients as consultants because of their lack of real communication skills, being weak on the commercial drivers of those clients, and a slowness in adapting to the modern process of delivering buildings in the 21st Century.


Old fashioned methods are risky and can lead to problems in delivery, where modern BIM tools used from RIBA stage 0 onward can de-risk the process and the clients liability.

Our role is often seen as diminished, where in fact the management of BIM data/models, and the application of technical detail to RIBA stage 2/3 and into 4 allows us to protect out clients and ourselves from costly and risky processes of design and to create more coordinated data set from the outset, to challenge other consultants and avoid costly technical failures at an early stage in 'virtual build' environment.

Chris is a visiting critic at UCL The Bartlett, Manchester School of Architecture, The CASS and The RCA as well as being a former RIBA Award Judge and current AJ Award Jury Chair for Culture 2018/19.


